# BOHO BAGPACK



**Created by: Hands of Zeal**

## Material

Hook size K;  
Scissors;  
Yarn Needle;  
Stitch Markers.

## Measurements:

Bottom of bag - 9" across  
Back straps - 19" long  
Granny Square - 8"x8"

## Notes\*

The body of the bag is 24 rows of 90 hdc

## Bottom of bag:

Start with magic circle

Round 1: 10 hdc in circle, join with a sl st to the first hdc.

Round 2: Ch 2, 2 hdc in each st around.

Round 3: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first st, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 4: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first 2 sts, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 5: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first 3 sts, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 6: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first 4 sts, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 7: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first 5 sts, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 8: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first 6 sts, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 9: Ch 2, \*1 hdc in first 7 sts, 2 hdc in the next,\* repeat around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 10: Ch 2, 1 hdc in the "v stitch" or back loops (the back loop of the top of the hdc as well as the loop behind the hdc) of the next st and each st around. Sl st in the first hdc.

Round 11-26: Ch 2, hdc in each st around. Sl st in the first hdc. (90 hdc)

## Granny Square:

Ch 12, join with a sl st to the first ch to form a circle

Round 1: Ch 1, 24 sc into the ring, sl st to the first sc. (24 sts)

Round 2: Ch 6, tr3tog over the next 3 sts (counts as tr4tog), [ch 6, tr4tog over the same st as the last tr of previous petal and the next 3 sts] 7 times, ch 7, sl st to the top of the 1st petal. Fasten off yarn.

Attach new color in the top of any petal

Round 3: Ch 1, 1 sc into the same place as ch 1, \*[6 sc in the next ch sp, 1 sc in the top of the next petal]\*, repeat around. Join with a sl st in the first sc.

Round 4: Ch 1, 1 sc in the same st as joining, 1 sc in the next two sts, \*ch 3, sk 2, sc in the next 12 sts\*, repeat around until the last 9 sts, 1 sc in

each of the last 9 sts. Join with a sl st to the first sc. Fasten off yarn.

Attach new color in any ch 3 sp

Round 5: Ch 4, tr2tog in the same sp, ch 4, tr4tog in same sp, ch 3, sl st in sp of ch 1 on top of petal, ch 4, tr3tog in same sp, ch 2, sk 1, 1 tr in each st across, skipping the last st, ch 2, \*tr3tog in corner sp, ch 4, tr4tog in same sp, ch 3, sl st in sp of ch 1 on top of petal, ch 4, tr3tog in same sp, ch 2, sk 1, 1 tr in each st across, skipping the last st, ch 2\*, repeat around, joining with a sl st in the top of the first petal. Fasten off.

Attach new color in any tr along the edge of the square.

Round 6: Ch 1, 1 sc in each st across, \*1 sc in ch 2 sp, 1 sc in top of next petal, 3 sc in next ch sp, sl st into the sp from the previous round that you placed your sl st in after the ch 3, now ch 3 and place a sc in the same sp, 3 sc in the next ch sp, 1 sc in top of next petal, 1 sc in ch 2 sp, 1 sc in each st across\*, repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first sc.

Fasten off

## Back Straps:

Ch 56

Row 1: 1 hdc in the 4th ch from the hook and in each st across. Ch 2, turn.

Row 2: 1 hdc in each st across. Finish off.

## Draw string:

Ch 100 (or longer if desired)

## Assembly

Decide where you would like to place the granny square. This will be the flap that goes over the backpack when it is closed. Keep the square in place by using stitch markers and the whip stitch the square to the top of the bag.

Now do one row of single crochet around the top of the entire piece; around the mouth of the backpack and up around the square.

Then take your drawstring and decide which row of hdc you would like your drawstring to be. Insert it between the hdc stitches on the desired row and weave it in and out all the way around. I did over two and then under two.

Flip your bag over and decide where you would like to place your back straps. Use stitch markers to keep them in place and try on the backpack before you sew the straps on to make sure you like the fit. Then sew the tops and bottoms of the straps in place.
